- What is allowed: Any type of art or craft, home baking such as pastries, cookies, cakes, squares. Baked goods must be tightly packaged in cling wrap, either separately or by the plate, or in sealed containers. No sampling is allowed.
- Other info: Please have a list of baking ingredients on display. Table coverings will not be provided, so you should bring your own tablecloth or plastic cover. It will be up to you to set your prices; all proceeds will go to the vendor. You will need to bring a cash float, as all sales will be cash only.

As you know, food banks are facing a significant increase in demand this year, particularly as the Christmas season approaches. SAFE-TRADE ZONES

In case you missed it, Ottawa police recently announced the setting up of three "safe-trade zones" to provide a level of security for people engaged in personal web shopping and trading. A growing number of police services have created this sort of protected zone for person-to-person online marketing, as websites are often used as tools to sell property and can present a personal safety risk due to the high volume of thefts and robberies that can occur during these transactions. Creating Safe-Trade parking spaces at OPS stations is about moving transactions away from secluded parking lots or private residences and bringing them into public places. The Safe-Trade spots in Ottawa are clearly marked by signage and a blue handshake logo painted on the pavement to help participants identify where to conduct safe exchanges. The East End Safe Trade zone is located at the Orleans Police Station, 3343 St-Joseph Blvd.
